Number	Question	Typical response
1	Am I eligible?	You must be a practicing teacher with a minimum of three years' teaching experience working with pupils up to 19 years of age. You must hold full Chartered College of Teaching membership (initial application may be made without membership, but if successful, membership will be required before starting the programme).
2	What counts as a practicing teacher?	A practicing teacher means you are a teacher professionally engaged in teaching either: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a) in the UK, Ireland, a Crown Dependency or a British Overseas Territory; b) in a Services Education Setting c) in a British International School (accredited under the Department for Education's British Schools overseas inspection scheme); or d) in none of the above, but who has completed initial teacher training in the UK.
3	I'm currently an NQT/RQT and interested in the programme but don't quite meet the 3 years of teaching criteria, are there any other options open to me?	You are eligible to sign up for our Certificate in Evidenced-informed Practice Programme . Successful completion of the certificate provides credits towards and direct entry to the Chartered Teacher programme once you have enough teaching experience.
4	I have some accessibility requirements....what support do you offer?	If you have specific accessibility or support requirements, please get in touch with us to discuss these so that we can ensure our content and programmes meet your requirements.
5	What access to resources will I receive once enrolled onto the programme?	You will gain access to MyPD (our virtual learning environment), have complimentary membership to British Educational Research Association, and IRIS Connect, a secure software platform that can support recording lessons and observations.
6	My School is willing to match fund the programme	Yes we are able to facilitate a split payment option between participants and schools.

7	If personal or professional changes occur that impact my ability to participate, can I defer my place on the programme?	We understand that from time to time, things may occur which may prevent participants from being able to complete the programme in the usual time frame. You will be able to defer your place on a programme and re-join the programme for up to 36 months after your original programme start date subject to the terms and conditions.
